ROGUE RIVER PEARS

Rogue River Bartlett pears are certainly money producers when eastern people are given a chance to bid for them. Yesterday the first carload of this fruit from this section reached the Chicago market, and it was sold for the very encouraging price of \$3.23 per box. This fruit was from the Burrell orchards. At these prices the net figures in Medford would be about \$2.20. No grower in the valley had expected they would realize more than \$1.75, or at most \$2, per box here, and at these prices the growers had figured on some very handsome profits from their orchards.

The Bartlett pear growers' profit can be best calculated when it is told that Mr. J. G. Gore, who has a seven-acre orchard of Bartletts, has already packed seven carloads of fruit from this orchard, and there are fully four more carloads now on the trees, making eleven carloads from these seven acres. These will average 460 boxes to the car, which at \$2.20 per box is \$1012 per car, or \$11,132 for the seven carloads, or \$1590 per acre.

Another item worthy of mention in connection with this Bartlett pear crop is that there are 40 acres in the Burrell orchard, and in it the crop is fully equal to that in the Gore orchard, and figuring at the above price the crop for this season will amount to \$63,600.

Already there have been about 79 carloads shipped from Medford, which at prices mentioned, would be over \$70,000, and much of the crop is still to be packed.

The prices for pears in all eastern markets were good yesterday, and there were indications that they would go even higher. In New York

the price paid was \$3.75 per box and in Boston \$4.15. The New York price would mean about \$2.50 net in Medford and the Boston price about \$2.85.—Medford Mail.
