MAN WHO PERFECTED PRINTING PRESS DEAD

London, Sept. 22.—Robert Hoe, of the printing press firm of Robert Hoe & Company, died here suddenly today.

Robert H. Hoe was born in New York in 1839, and has probably done more for the improvement of printing presses than any other man.

Upon attaining manhood he entered the printing press factory of R. Hoe & Company, founded by his grandfather, and developed the printing press from the "Hoe cylinder" of the 1846 patent to the present double sextuple type, the most successful printing press manufactured.

Hoe is also a manufacturer of circular saws and saw bits, and has large factories in New York and London. He is one of the founders of the Metropolitan Museum of Arts. Hoe made his home in New York City.
