When the tragic accident occurred the machine was speeding at 30 miles an hour. They had just struck a sharp curve on Hopkins street, in Elmhurst, which Tischner was attempting to negotiate when the heavy automobile skidded and crashed into the iron piece on the all diseases of the lungs, side of the street and turned turtle.
