BUSINESS MEN'S LEAGUE BANQUET FRIDAY NIGHT

As a preliminary to the banquet, the third annual feed of the Salem business men, all the members of the Business Men's League will meet at the Board of Trade rooms at 8:15 Friday evening. You need not ask why, but just be there. The banquet will be given at the Elite Cafe at 9 o'clock. The heads of all the state institutions have been invited, and will probably be there. It is going to be a great time, a genial, social time, where the business men all get in closer touch and cement more strongly the bonds that unite them in a concerted effort for the betterment of Salem. No stronger endorsement of the pull-together movement inaugurated three years ago could be found than the nearly 2000 new residences built in Salem since the business men got together. Since the first banquet an electric road has been completed to Falls City, miles of streets have been paved, and the beginning of the work on the line to Eugene and another to Mehama has been made. This may not all be due to Salem pulling together, but much of it is. It remains to be seen what the next few years will do, but the esperance and the fulfillment both promise much, and both are based on what has been done. and the marshal handcuffed him and turned him over to Mr. Scott, while the remainder of the posse with himself continued after Nicholich. Nicholich was given every opportunity to give himself up. Marshal Flaegel called repeatedly to him to surrender, but Nicholich continued to run until a volley from the guns held in the hands of the posse brought the fleeing convict to the ground, but for a short time only. Nicholich had hardly fallen when he was up again and sped toward the timber within a hundred yards to the left and into the brush he plunged head first. The posse drew near and after waiting a few seconds the Austrian outlaw yelled that he would give up and emerged from the thicket with his hands raised. The volley fired by the posse at Nicholich while he was running struck him in the hip, inflicting a flesh wound, and another bullet hit him in the wrist, also passing through only the skin and flesh. The shackles were put on him after his wounds were humanely taken care of, and after picking up Mr. Scott and his charge, Murray, the automobile was entered and the fugitives brought back to Independence and lodged in the city jail.

ONE DEAD, TWO ARE WOUNDED

This Is the Brief History of the Break for Liberty of Five Convicts Last Friday Night.

The man hunt has now come to an end, and when Warden Curtiss at the Oregon penitentiary took an invoice of the "cons" who escaped found two dead, one shot through the shoulder and breast and another in the hip and wrist, and still another who escaped injury but whose physical condition is very poor and his spirit broken.

At 5 o'clock last night the last man of the five who escaped from their guards at the School for the Feeble Minded was surrounded and captured four miles north of Buena Vista by a posse composed of City Marshal Flaegel of Independence, Floyd Williams, Harold Steward and W. A. Scott, after a brief run through the stubble fields and short brush on the Scott place. Mike Nicholich surprised the officers by surrendering without gun play, while Murray, the other man who was at large, after the disastrous battle on the Lucklamute river, south of Buena Vista Sunday morning, threw up his hands and gave himself up when the officers ordered him to halt.

Near 4:30 o'clock last evening Marshal Flaegel of Independence received a telephone call from E. Kaiser, a farmer residing on the Bowers ranch, that two men believed to be Nicholich and Murray, the escapes, were seen at a hay stack on the ranch. The marshal at once organized a posse in an automobile and they hurried to the Bowers farm. Nicholich and Murray were seen running across a field and the officer and his men made chase, accompanied by W. A. Scott, on whose place the escapes had ran. After calling on him a few times to halt, Murray stopped short and threw up his hands

had been hiding and wandering about since. Nicholich positively refused to talk with either the Independence officers or Warden Curtiss, who went to Independence and brought the prisoners back with him in an auto. The Austrian maintained an affected ignorance, but it is probable that he could relate a very interesting story of his actions since escaping from the guards at the School for the Feeble Minded last Friday night. The two bullet wounds inflicted on Nicholich by the officers last evening adds two more to the two he already possessed. Nicholich's experience in making escapes is not limited. A blood-thirsty posse of men of his own nationality gave him a hard run two years ago near Sweet Home when he, accompanied by another man, robbed an Austrian wood chopper's camp. Nicholich was shot twice in this running fight, both bullets entering his leg on the inside of the thigh. When arrested by Sheriff Minto in this city a short time after the Sweet Home affair for robbing a dwelling near Turner Nicholich had the two wounds in his leg when arrested by Sheriff Minto, but where he got them he would not disclose at the time. Later he told the whole story.

George Duncan, the convict who was shot by Walter Johnson in the duel Saturday night in Buena Vista, succumbed from the shot in the stomach last night at 11 o'clock. His suffering was great up to a short time before he passed away. Sheriff is still alive, but his condition is critical.
