AGREE TO MODIFY SEAMEN'S BILL AS APPLIED TO RIVER MEN

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE] Washington, Dec. 20.—The house marine committee engaged in considering the LaFollette seamen's bill agreed tentatively yesterday to modify the measure to the extent of permitting such owners who operate only on rivers, bays and sounds to employ crews familiar only with such navigation, and not necessarily experienced in ocean sailing. Patrick Flynn, of San Francisco, addressing the committee, declared it impossible for stewards and firemen to get drill enough to be able to handle lifeboats reliably, on account of the pressure of their own work.

MRS. SING ACQUITTED.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE] Chicago, Dec. 20.—Mrs. Alice Sing, white, was acquitted yesterday afternoon of murdering her husband, Chas. Sing, a rich Chinese restaurant proprietor. Judge McDonald, holding that the state had failed to make out a case said it was unnecessary to hear testimony for the defense and instructed the verdict.
