Naval Appropriation May Break Records

Washington, Oct. 16.—Naval appropriations are likely to break records against the coming session of congress. This became known today in connection with the announcement that a vast amount of work ahead, will meet November 20 to begin consideration of the naval bill. In naval circles it was predicted the appropriation, unless the "little navy" members slaughter the bill, will mount up to \$320,000,000 or more. The navy department is now working on the estimates. The bill of last session carried \$312,000,000.

BLUE SKY LAWS ARGUED

Washington, Oct. 16.—Arguments in cases affecting the blue sky laws of three states—Ohio, Michigan and South Dakota—were begun in the supreme court this afternoon. Attorneys general of the states handled their side of the controversy and former Attorney General Wickersham, in behalf of the Investment Bankers association, appeared as one of counsel attacking the constitutionality of the laws. In the South Dakota case, Attorney General Childwell appeared from a state decree of unconstitutionality.
