conference and at various owner/manager retreats and continuing-education workshops throughout the year.

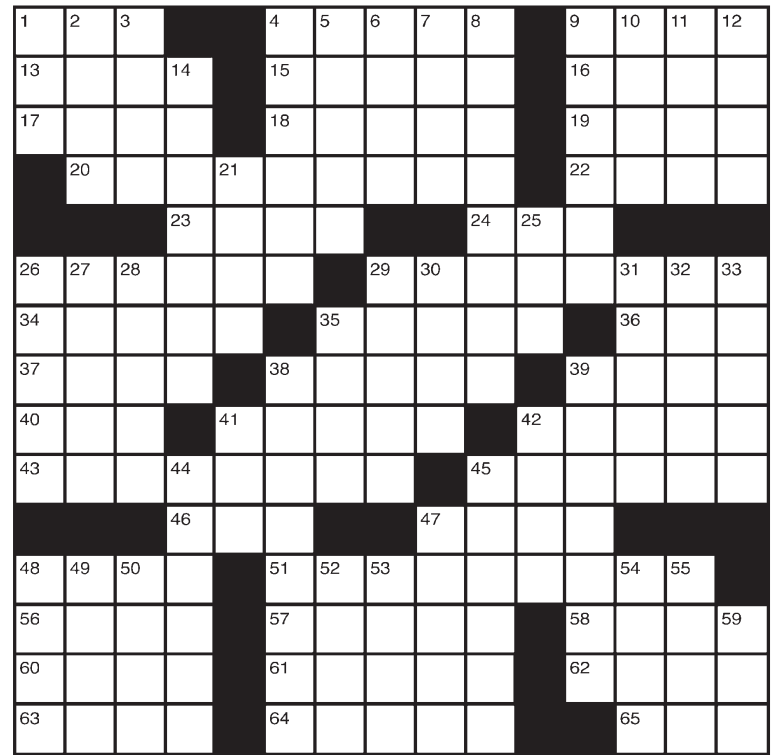
FitLife associated clubs have a passion for health and wellness and have extremely high standards of professionalism. This sets them apart from “box gyms.”
