## Girls tennis improves every match

Dezrae Sunnabend and Sarah Frings.

In singles play, Kenna Cardin (No. 3 singles) defeated Ciara Gates 6-0, 6-0. It was Cardin's first-ever singles match.

"She was unbelievably consistent," stated Fullhart. "That is the only possible way to win a match this decisively!"

The Outlaws were only able to complete five matches with Junction City, as the weather turned and the match had to be called.

Kiley Mehlbrech and Olivia Curran of JC came out strong in the first set of No. 1 doubles against Weems and Farr-Baenziger, and just like that the Lady Outlaws were down 5-0, and ended up with a 6-1 loss. The duo tweaked their strategy on their service games, and the momentum switched. Brenna and Jesse took the second set with a decisive 6-2 win.

Lacey Gilmore won her match 8-1, and Coach Fullhart had nothing but praise for the young sophomore.


