• The Adult Foster Home previously called **Absolute Serenity Adult Foster Care** is now called **Helen’s House**.

Absolute Serenity is in the final stages of opening new adult foster-care facilities in Sisters. The homes will be named after residents cared for over the years by Absolute Serenity.

“Helen was our very first resident,” said David Tolle. “She moved in the day after we became licensed in 2009. Without her, our business might not have succeeded, as she was our only resident for the first few months. She loved our kids and we all loved her. Helen quickly taught us that we wouldn’t just be taking care of people, we would be inheriting new family members. This small, intimate, home setting really allows everyone to become pretty close-knit.”

“We would highly recommend Absolute Serenity to anyone needing compassionate care for their loved one,” her daughter wrote. “My mother, Helen, was the first resident in their home when they started the care facility. They treated her like one of the family and us as well. They are a wonderful family with three children that became like grandkids to her. My mom couldn’t have had better care up until the end of her life.”
