SALEM (AP) — Lawmakers wrapped up the legislative session, but the to-do list for next year is taking shape.

A transportation-funding plan fizzled this year, but groups advocating for projects will continue their push.

Universities got a big increase in funding but say they still need more money.

Lawmakers approved funding to build subsidized apartments, but they failed to pass a bill creating the framework to spend the money. And liberal groups are still pushing a higher minimum wage.
