

Temporary closure in place on Whychus Creek

The Sisters Ranger District has temporarily closed public access near Chush Falls on Whychus Creek to allow for construction of recreation improvements and road decommissioning.

From October 19-30 a closure area from Whychus Creek on the west to Snow Creek on the east, Three Sisters Wilderness on the south, to Forest Road 641 on the north and including Forest

Service Roads 1514-600, 1514-670, 1514-750, 1514-685, 1514-680 and the Chush Falls Trail #4080 will be temporarily closed.

David (Dave) W. Childress passed away October 11, 2015, surrounded by his family and friends after a long battle with cancer.

While living in Sisters, Dave attended The Chapel in the Pines in Camp Sherman. There he was enfolded by a group of loving and supportive friends.

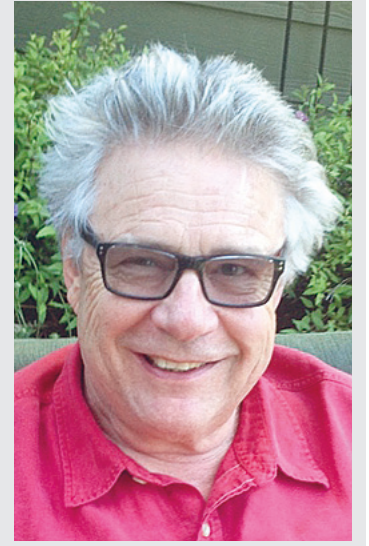
Dave enjoyed participating in car shows in Central Oregon and the coast of

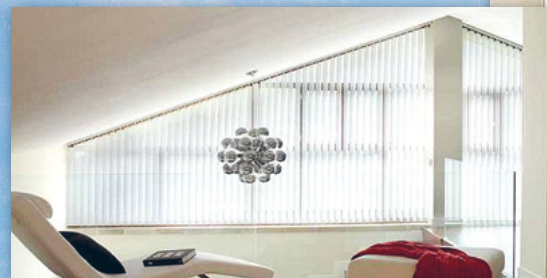
