we'll decide what people want to do, what we *can* do and then go from there."

Frye told *The Nugget* that he has not seen a draft of the report.

It will be up to the council to decide how to proceed after reviewing the report, but Frye noted that they will receive legal guidance from the city attorney and the city's insurance carrier.

Gorayeb was placed on paid administrative leave on February 25 as the City requested the outside investigation. Gorayeb told *The Nugget* at that time, "My hopeful expectation is that I will be exonerated and this is something procedural that had to happen because of the nature of things."

City Recorder Kathy Nelson and Public Works Director Paul Bertagna have been handling leadership duties at City Hall in Gorayeb's absence.
