## Michael Stephen Waverly

March 17, 1943 – June 15, 2016

Michael Stephen Waverly, 73, passed away unexpectedly on June 15, in Roseville, California, surrounded by his loving family.

He was born on March 17, 1943, in Portland to Joseph and Rosemary Waverly.

He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in business and technology with a minor in food technology, from Oregon State University in 1966.

Michael started a successful career in the



fiberboard and particleboard business in Albany. He eventually worked all over the country, with extended stays in Oregon, Montana, North Carolina, California, New Mexico and Maryland. He was well-respected in the business and known to be tough but fair.

In 2003, Michael married Mimi, retired, and moved to Roseville, California. This stage of his life brought great joy in traveling with Mimi, spending time with her family and his children and grandchildren.

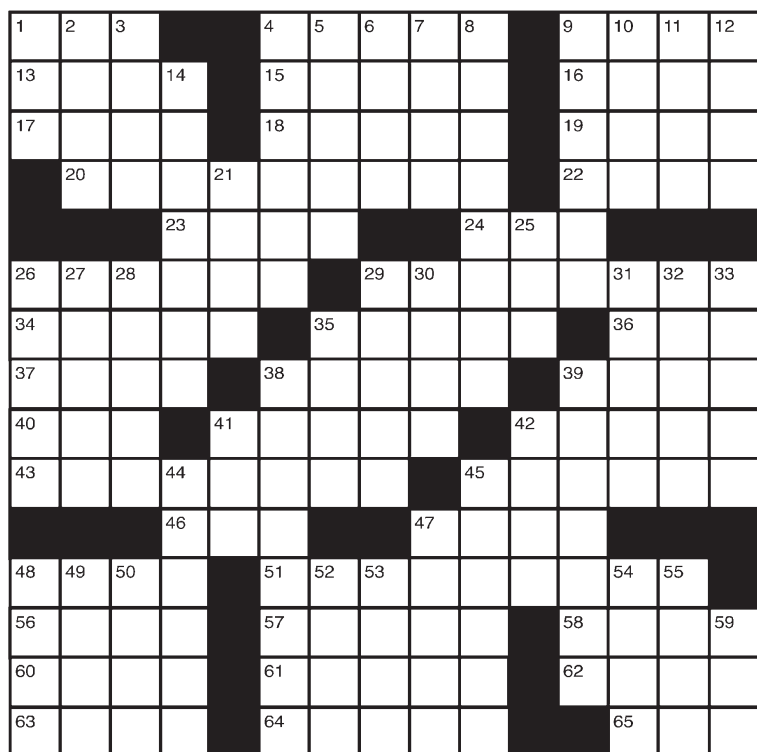
