and deliveries on Thursdays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. This volunteer needs to be able to help lift heavy furniture on and off the truck. They also need someone to mow the lawn, trim shrubs, pull weeds, sweep the driveway or shovel snow as needed, and a jack-of-all trades who can help load and unload, rearrange furniture on the floor and help keep things flowing.

This could be one or several people each doing a share — a few hours here, a few hours there.

At both stores, volunteers will be trained and you can choose your own days and shifts (Monday through Saturday, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 1 to 5 p.m.) — or just come in for a few hours on days you can or be on call to fill an empty shift. You can choose to do the jobs you are comfortable doing.

“It would be a big help to find people who can work the register on Mondays and Saturdays, both shifts,” ReStore Manager Robin Tawney said. “Our volunteers are the greatest and we are grateful for the support we receive from the community.”

# Henderson makes jazzy Sisters stop

Jared Henderson, a graduate of Sisters High School and Berklee College of Music, paid a visit to his hometown last week, concluding the trip with an intimate evening of jazz music at The Barn on Saturday, July 30.

The show was part of Henderson’s swing through Oregon with his friend and fellow musician Christian Li, also a Berklee grad. Adam Carlson of Bend joined the pair on drums after Sisters-based drummer Justin Veloso was unable to join as part of the Jared Henderson Trio due to another engagement.

Mixing up traditional jazz tunes with compositions of their own, Henderson tore it up on his stand-up bass, while Li wowed the crowd with equally vibrant keyboarding skills.

Henderson started playing bass while in middle school here in Sisters where his father, Jody, taught music for many years. Years of practice and performance helped him land a full scholarship at Berklee. He graduated there in 2013 and later moved to New York City to be part of the music scene there. He has toured extensively as well.

Henderson’s love for Sisters and its mountains was evident in the fact that two of his own songs paid homage to the area. One tune, called “The Guardians,” was

inspired by Henderson’s feeling that the Three Sisters look over the town almost as though protecting the town and its people.

“It’s just so nice to be here in Sisters and being able to perform,” he said between songs.

Brad Tisdell helped arrange the venue and sound as a help to the young musicians. About 60 people attended the event, including a number of former classmates, coaches and family friends.

In addition to Saturday’s concert, Henderson played at Classic Pianos in Portland on July 24, at Roaring Rapids Pizza Parlour in Eugene on July 26, and at the Old Stone Church in Bend on July 28. When not performing, Henderson spent time in the mountains, including a hike

up Tam MacArthur Rim, as well as catching up with old friends. Rob and Samra Spear of Sisters provided a home base for Henderson and his friends during their stay.

Henderson is the son of Jody and Serina Henderson, who are now residing in Vermont, where Jody has continued his work as a band teacher at Woodstock High School.

# Forest Service to replace culvert


In mid-August the Forest Service will be installing a new culvert under Forest Service Road 2058 on the Sisters Ranger District, which will require the road to be closed during construction.

The culvert will improve the passage of fish and other aquatic species in Indian Ford Creek. The closure of the road will begin on August 15, and will be in effect until construction is completed, which is anticipated to be October 15.

During the closure the public is advised to use County Road 1102 and Forest Road 2050 as an alternate route in the area.
