BEND. (AP) — Bend officials have decided to allow voters to weigh in on a 3 percent sales tax on recreational marijuana.

The Bulletin reports that the Bend City Council approved a measure that puts the tax proposal on the Nov. 8 ballot. If approved by voters, it would become the city's first sales tax and would go into effect in January.
