11 years.

District residents pay a property tax to fund the cost of the principal and interest on the bonds. The amount of property tax levied each year to service the bond debt should be less for District residents as a result of the bond sale.

Sisters-Camp Sherman

Fire District Board President Chuck Newport said, "Our staff and board of directors are always looking for opportunities to be more efficient with property tax revenue, and this was a logical option for us."

Fire Chief Roger Johnson said, "We felt that the current interest rates were at risk of increasing, and it would be in the best interest of the District residents to act now."

The total amount of refunding bonds issued were \$1.88 million.
