Veterans organization has national reach

Warfighter Outfitters was born in Sisters and operates out of here — but its reach extends far beyond Central Oregon.

In 2016, the nonprofit served "just a hair over 2,000 veterans," according to founder Brett Miller, himself a combat-wounded veteran of the war in Iraq.

Warfighter Outfitters (www.facebook.com/war fighteroutfitters) was founded by veterans and is run by

veterans to provide fellow veterans with the opportunity to get into the outdoors and pursue activities they love despite troubled times and injuries.

The organization offers three types of experience: hunting trips; fishing; and "engagement missions." Wounded veterans, many working through post-traumatic stress, come from all over the country to connect with each other and with activities that make them feel
