Grad Night Fundraiser

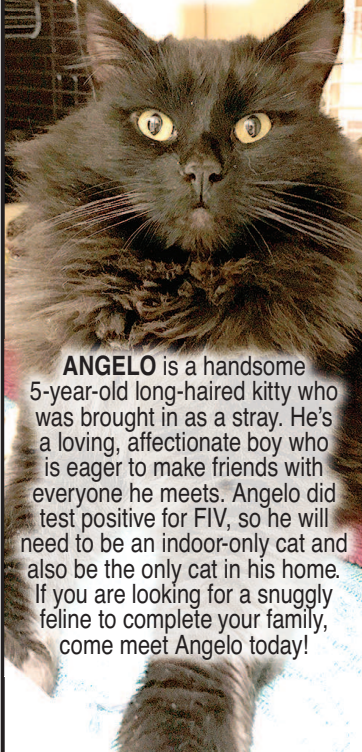
