and international.

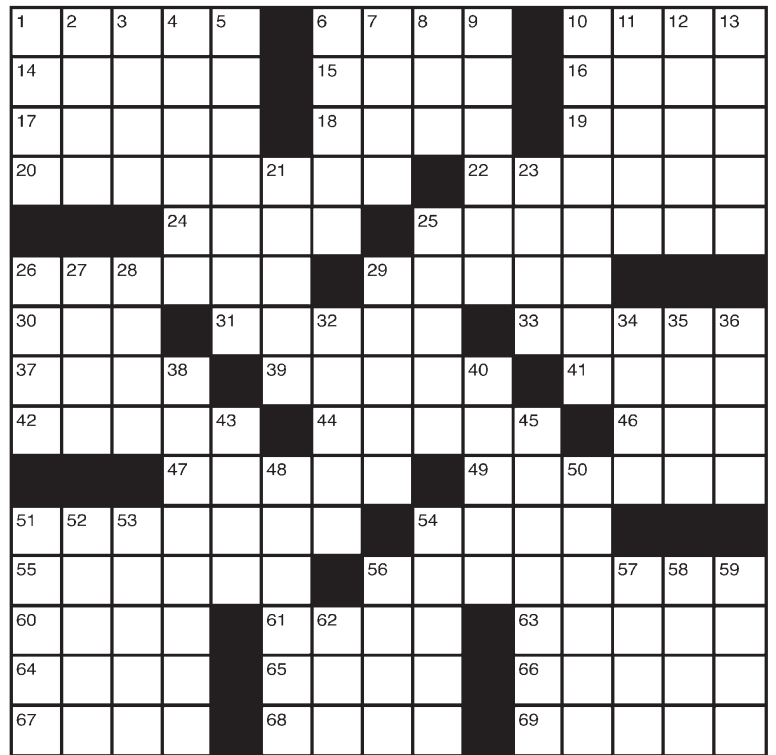
