lightweight, portable device that delivers an electric shock through the chest to the heart. That shock can stop an irregular heart rhythm and allow normal heart function to resume.

The American Heart Association estimates that immediate cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and early defibrillation with an AED can substantially increase a victim's chance of survival.

"Every second counts when it comes to treating Sudden Cardiac Arrest," according to Sisters-Camp Sherman Fire District Chief Roger Johnson. "We want to do everything we can in our

coverage area to maximize survivability."
