Apartment complex expected next year

If everything goes according to plan, a new 48-unit affordable-housing apartment complex will be providing housing by spring 2018 for renters who earn no more than 60 percent of the median income for Deschutes County.

At an open house last Thursday at Sisters City Hall, Sisters residents were able to view preliminary drawings and elevations for the units. Tom Kemper and Keith

Wooden of HousingWorks were on hand to answer questions and provide information to interested citizens.

The development will occupy two separate parcels of land along Brooks Camp Road, behind Ray's Food Place. The larger parcel, which is also bounded by West McKinney Butte Road, will accommodate 32 one-bedroom, 600-squarefoot apartments; four twobedroom, 900-square-foot units; and four three-bedroom



She has welcomed countless immigrants since her own arrival in 1886, and she is seen here holding a smallbodied parlor guitar — which came into being around the same time," McGregor says "Stories and poems from around the world evolved
