# Sisters furniture-maker Council sets goals for City

Sisters City Council voted to approve the 2017/18 City of Sisters Council Goals and Objectives at last week's Council meeting.

The goals the Council will focus their efforts on are: economic growth and diversity; financial transparency and accountability; organizational and operational effectiveness; and effective public communication and outreach.

This year's goals were determined through a process involving the Council, the City manager, City department heads, and examples of goal setting materials from other Central Oregon communities.

The resulting document will aid in building the budget for the coming fiscal year and can be adjusted as needed with the passage of time and development of new circumstances.

A helpful tool has been created where the four main goals are listed across the top of a grid, along with estimated cost, the fund(s) involved, and the budget year charged. Listed down the grid, by department responsible for a project, are the objectives/ activities planned for fiscal year 2017/18, with a designation of the goals being addressed by the objective.

For example, the Community Development Department has as an objective to evaluate the development code for livability standards and improvements to economic development. One of the activities that will be undertaken in support of that will be to make revisions to the municipal code. That activity supports three of the four main goals.

The grid will serve as both a roadmap and a checklist for any activities undertaken by the Council or City departments. It provides an assessment tool at any time to see if the City is on course to attain their goals. If a particular project isn't supporting one of the overall goals, then it either shouldn't be considered, or it is an indication that the goal/ objectives need to be revisited.

When the budget committee meets in May, they will be able to use the grid to determine if a specific budget item request will support any of the four major Council goals.


