Fire damage was limited to a 3-foot-by-3-foot area where

the pellet stove flue passed through the exterior wall of the home.

Man accused of pointing gun at neighbor over chickens

COOS BAY (AP) — Coos County sheriff’s deputies arrested a man accused of threatening his neighbor with a shotgun in a dispute over roaming chickens.

The Coos Bay World reports the neighbor told deputies he asked Anthony Lewis, 56, to remove chickens that wandered onto his property.

Lewis responded by returning to the property armed with a shotgun, which he allegedly pointed at the neighbor while yelling: “I’m

gonna kill you, white trash.” The sheriff’s office said Lewis admitted going to his neighbor’s property with a loaded shotgun.

Court records show the Coos Bay man was charged with menacing, unlawful use of a weapon and pointing a firearm at another.

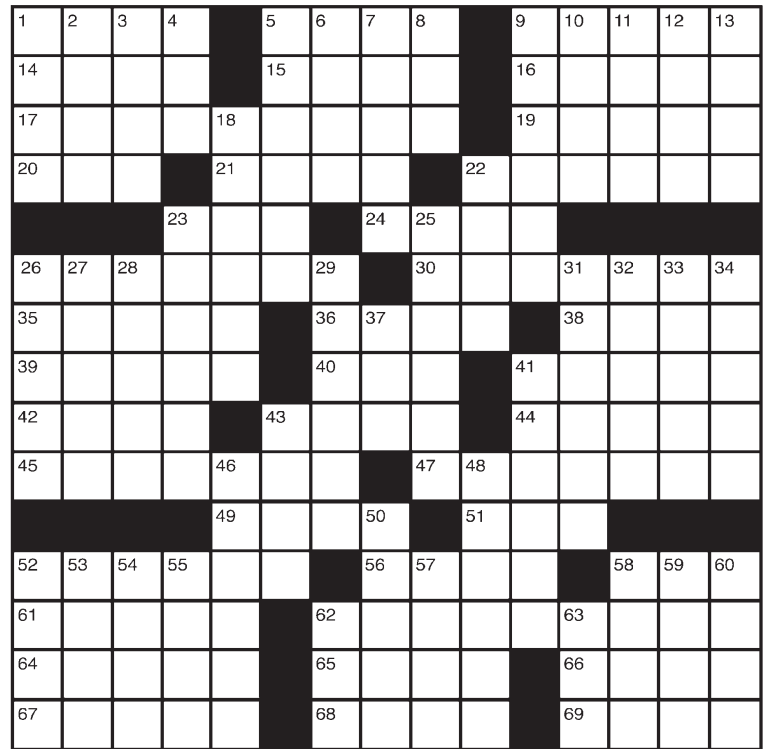
Lewis was released from jail over the weekend on the condition he not contact his neighbor. A preliminary hearing has been scheduled for April 28.
