Sisters did receive several penalties and had to play a man down for eight minutes. The squad was competitive on the face-offs and won nine of the 21.

Friend recorded six ground balls, and Ethan Kennedy and Kokesh-Carhart each had four. Casey Warburton had 12 saves in the contest.

Patton said, "We did a better job this game of moving the ball around and getting shots off on offense. We struggled a little with our one-onone defense, but got better as the game went on. We need to do a better job of staying out of the penalty box."

A day later, the Outlaws were busy with their annual service day. Players and family members from the entire program volunteered and worked on the school grounds.

The Outlaws were to play at Bend on Tuesday, April 25. On Thursday, April 27, Sisters will travel to Burns.
