

Golfers play at Awbrey Glen

The boys golf team participated in the Mt. View Invite at Awbrey Glen on Friday, April 28, and finished with a team score of 426.

Summit took championship honors with a team score of 304. Bend was runner-up at 355, and Mt. View took third, just one stroke back at 356. Remaining scores were: Redmond (380), Crook County (382), and La Pine (425).

Andrew Mayes didn't have a great start to his round, but lowered his score by two on the back nine. Mayes finished with a 100, the lowest score on the team. Peyton Myhre was just three strokes back at 103.

Coach Bill Mitchell said, "Andrew is our most consistent player. He doesn't try to swing too hard; he just swings smoothly. And Peyton is a pleasant surprise. He's a

junior and this is his first year playing golf. He's listened to instruction and has a nice grip and swing."

Wyatt Hernandez carded a 109, Austin Lake shot a 114, and Kade Owen recorded a 118.

Coach Bill Mitchell told *The Nugget* that as a whole the team is recording way too many sevens, eights, and nines on their cards.

"We could easily be under 400 as a team if we'd cut down on those high number of strokes," said Coach Bill Mitchell. "I'm hoping the boys work hard and break 100. If they could just shoot bogey golf they would shoot a 90."

The Outlaws were to play at Meadow Lakes on Monday, May 1. Sisters will host a tournament at Black Butte Ranch on Thursday, May 4. Districts will be held Monday and Tuesday, May 8 and 9, at Tokatee.

in the development and management of complex operating assets, with the creativity necessary to realize a vision for the future."

Both candidates acknowledge challenges faced by the district, which Wentworth identifies as "ranging from broad demographics, to economic and community development, to optimizing our buildings and facilities, all of which impact the educational experience."

Gregg sees challenges "including communication, enrollment, programs and building strong relationships within our school communities."

Incumbent Clark pledges to continue to "advocate for

expanding our career/technical and advanced placement class offerings and for additional foreign language options starting at the elementary level."

Wilkins is a parent and coach in the district. He brings a military and business background to the board, along with several years of involvement on district committees.

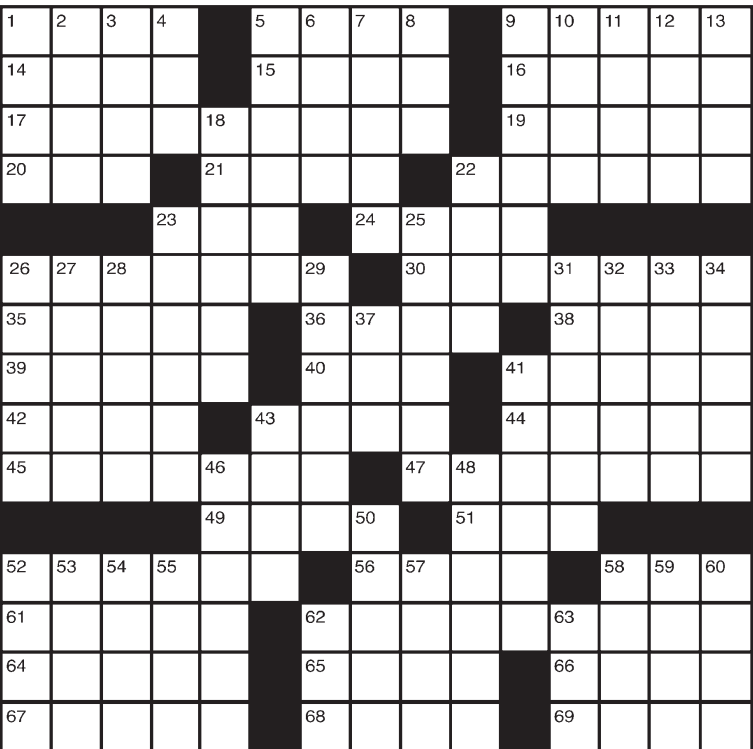
