Trust, Oregon Humanities, and others. He earned his Certified Festival & Event Executive certification from IFEA/Purdue University.

Although he spent six years in Idaho, Remington says, "I am an Oregonian through and through."

Steven was a founding member of the Oregon Bluegrass Association, helped launch Portland's Waterfront Blues Festival with two other founders, was a founder of the Oregon Truffle Festival and produced the annual Eugene Celebration, among many other achievements in nonprofit management and festival production.

"I feel so lucky to have this opportunity to contribute to the legacy of Sisters Folk Festival," he said. "It's an honor for me to follow Katy Yoder, to work with this stellar staff and board, and to join the many volunteers
