His formative years were spent in Southern California where he explored the deserts, the mountains and the ocean. Throughout his youth he made a living as a freelance graphic artist, a metalsmith, and a wooden toy-maker. He moved to Oregon with his wife, Joy, to escape the growing encroachments of mankind upon his former paradise. They had two sons, Clare and Gabe, then settled in the small town of Sisters. Socioeconomic changes of the late 1970s led him to become a barber just prior to divorcing from Joy. He lovingly adorned the townsfolk of Sisters with stylish hairdos for over two decades while he continued to derive deeply philosophical and spiritual joy from his appreciation of nature.

In 2001, Jack moved with his son Gabe to



Livingston, Montana, where he opened another barber shop. Together with his son, they explored the far-reaching nooks and crannies of Montana in all its splendor. He retired in September of 2016 and moved to Butte, Montana, to live with Gabe.

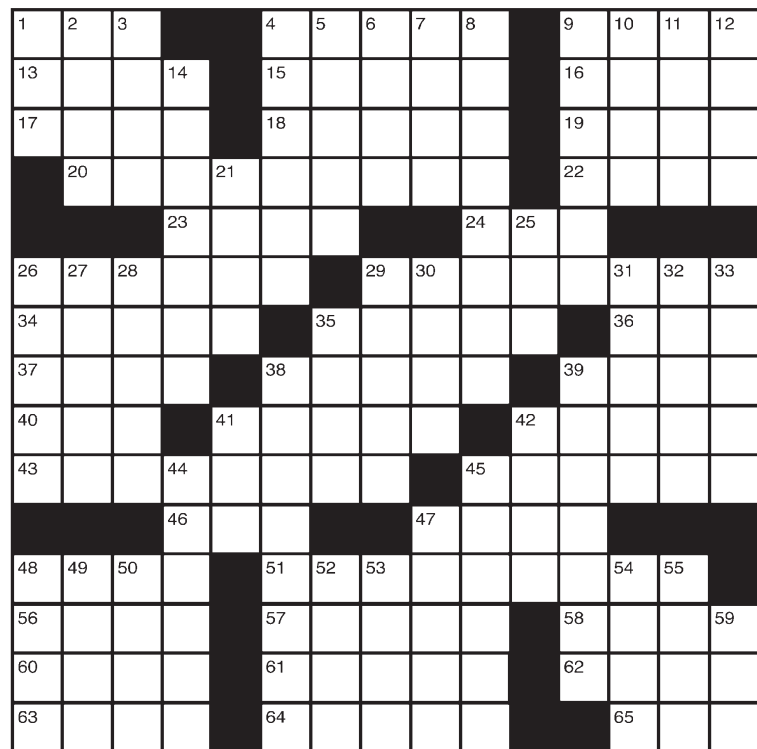
