With mild, spring-like weather, Suttle Lake and other bodies of water in Sisters Country are inviting — but the waters can be dangerously cold.

With the recent mild, almost spring-like temperatures, many locals and visitors alike are taking to the water, rather than the ski slopes, to recreate in Central Oregon.

The Sisters-Camp Sherman Fire District warns that complacency on the water — especially when water temperatures are low — is extremely dangerous.

That danger was highlighted last month when a Prineville man died in Ochoco Reservoir when his canoe overturned. One occupant of the canoe made it to shore, the other, Christopher Callahan, age 36, did not. Neither was wearing a life vest.

According to the National Center for Cold Water Safety, immersion in cold water is immediately life threatening for anyone not wearing thermal protection such as a wet suit or dry suit. If you're not using thermal protection, cold water making contact with the skin creates cold shock, and causes an immediate loss of breathing control.
