

LACROSSE: Outlaws won a thriller on Saturday

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as long-pole defender and was a big physical presence on the field. Matt Harris also had some big contributions as he directed the defense and got some critical ground balls. Jake Stevens did his job on the face-offs and got the Outlaws possession of the ball.

Morgan led all scorers with four goals. Jared Richerson scored a hat-trick, and Stadeli, Friend, and Kinnon Rutherford each added a goal.

Patton told *The Nugget* that the stand-out player of the game was Casey Warburton, who made some great plays in the goal that took the wind out of Marist's sails. Warburton had 14 saves on 26 shots.

Saturday's win was a thriller for the Outlaws. They were down 10-7 in the final quarter, and scored five unanswered goals to post the victory.

The Outlaws scored two goals to pull to within one, and then Noah Keeton scored off a Morgan assist to tie it up 10-10 with two minutes left on the clock.

Sisters was a man down due to a penalty, but the defense got a big stop and cleared the ball to the offensive end. Ethan Morgan stepped it up, made a dodge and scored for the go-ahead goal. After the face-off, Sisters got the ball and Morgan scored again to put the Outlaws up by two to seal the win.

"This was a big win for us against a quality opponent," said Coach Patton. "McNary came into the game with an 8-4 record, including a 12-10 win against Mt. View the night before. Having our team closer to full strength was a big factor. But, the biggest difference in the game was that we won the ground-ball battle."

The Outlaws were still short-handed on defense and Sam Mitchel, Ethan Morgan, and Matt Harris played the whole game. Ethan Morgan, Trey Stadeli, and Noah Keeton were the lone attackmen and all had great performances.

Warburton made some big saves which kept the game close and made the come back possible. Casey had 11 saves on 36 shots.

Scoring leaders were Ethan Morgan, who scored five goals; and Trey Stadeli and Tyler Friend, who scored two each.

The Outlaws were to play at home against Summit on Tuesday, May 1. They will wrap up their week at the SALI Tournament on Saturday and Sunday, May 5 and 6.

Firewood cutting season opens in Sisters Country

Personal-use firewood collection on the Deschutes National Forest got underway May 1, and will remain open through November 30. Firewood permits are on sale at Forest Service offices across Central Oregon and at select businesses.

Permits sell for \$10 per cord with a minimum two-cord purchase required. Each household may purchase up to 8 cords annually. Permit holders will receive a publication illustrating the areas where the public has access to collect firewood after purchasing a firewood permit.

It is the responsibility of the permit holder to read the publication in order to understand which tree species are available for firewood cutting and gathering in the designated areas. It is prohibited to possess or remove trees that have been cut illegally.

Many areas have different opening dates, and some have off-road vehicle use restrictions. Permit holders need to pay particular attention to the rules and regulations as well as the specific cutting designations listed on each cutting area map in the synopsis. Compliance with these regulations will allow the Forest Service to continue to offer

new cutting areas.

Firewood cutters are required to carry a shovel, an 8 oz. capacity or larger fire extinguisher, and have their chainsaw equipped with an approved spark arrester.

During spring months many forest roads are still inaccessible due to snow. Forest visitors are asked to use extreme care to avoid getting stuck or causing extensive and illegal resource damage to the land and vegetation.

As Sisters moves into the hot, dry summer months, public use restrictions may be implemented. Restrictions could limit the hours that firewood cutting is available, or prohibit them entirely during periods of high fire danger. Restrictions will be announced by 6 p.m. on the day prior and will be posted to Central Oregon National Forest websites and through the Central Oregon Interagency Dispatch Center at <https://gacc.nifc.gov/nwcc/districts/COIDC/>
