

Boys tennis splits matches

The boys tennis team defeated Crook County at home on Tuesday, April 24. The match ended four-four in matches, but the Outlaws won the tiebreaker 9-8 in sets. Two days later, they lost 5-2 at Philomath.

On Tuesday, junior Jed Kizziar continued his winning streak and remains undefeated in league. Jed defeated Alex Nyman 6-2, 6-3. Jed’s top-notch play has secured him a valuable high seed in the district tournament.

“Jed challenges his opponents by consistently coming to the net, and forces them to hit more aggressive shots than they are comfortable with,” said Coach Carl Click. “His athleticism and quick hands at the net enable him to handle almost anything they hit at him.”

The other two victories for the Outlaws came in doubles play. Aaron Johnson and Sam Mayes won straight sets at the No. 2 spot. The duo defeated Jordon Owens and Garrett Bond 6-1 in the first set and then the duo came back in the second set where they were down 1-4 and rallied for the win.

“The sophomores have

stepped up their game with strong skill development in practice,” said Click. “Johnson kept points alive at the base-line, while the lanky Bates put away winners at the net.”

Sophomores George Bates and Drew Collins-Burke cruised at the third spot with scores of 6-3, 6-1.

Sisters needed a straight sets win at No. 3 singles from junior Isaiah Chapen to secure the team victory, and Chapen dug deep to pull off the win. Isaiah defeated Holt Porfily 6-2 in the first set, and with determination won the second-set 7-6 (10-8) tiebreaker. He was down twice in the tie-breaker, including a set point, but persevered to win the match.

Nate Weber gave it his all at No. 2 singles, but lost in three sets, 6-3, 4-6, 6-1, to Javi Dominguez.

“Nate’s opponent was probably the best player he’s seen at the No. 2 singles spot in league play,” said Click.

Two days later, Sisters’ lone wins came from Kizziar and Weber, at the No. 1 and No. 2 singles’ spots.

Kizziar bested Colton Beckstead 7-6 (7-5), 6-4, and solidified his position as the top singles seed into the district tournament. The Outlaws are currently 3-3-1 in league.

“Olivia is very speedy and quick,” said Trott. “She positioned herself behind the goal and was consistently able to bring the ball up from the defensive side to the attack. She did a really great job with that.”

Summit ran a tight zone defense, and their goalie did an incredible job.

“She (goalie) moved so fast, and blocked almost everything,” said Trott. “She saved 26 of our 30 shots on goal.”

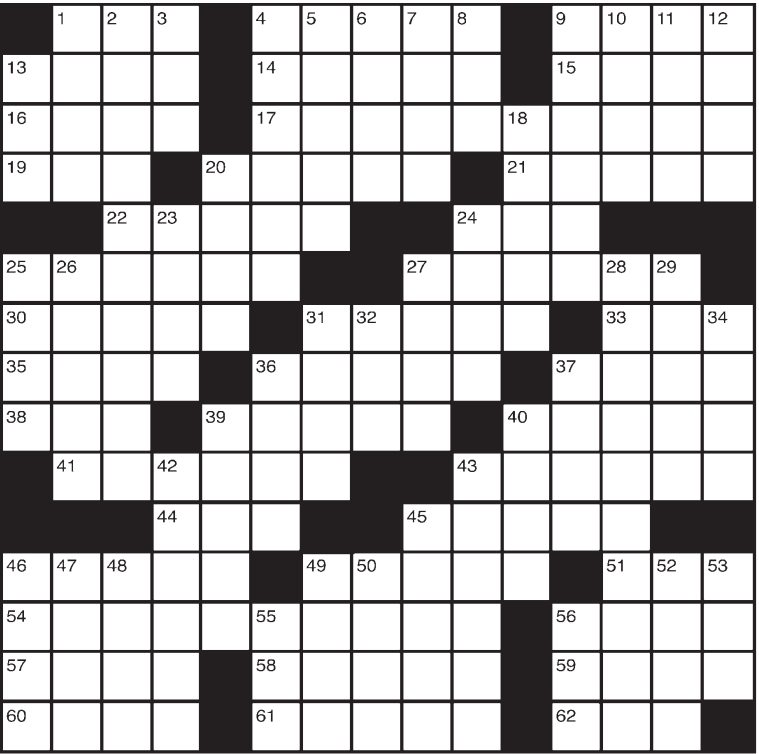
