And, she notes, "we still have builders who build custom homes ... as long as the economy stays good, we should be OK."

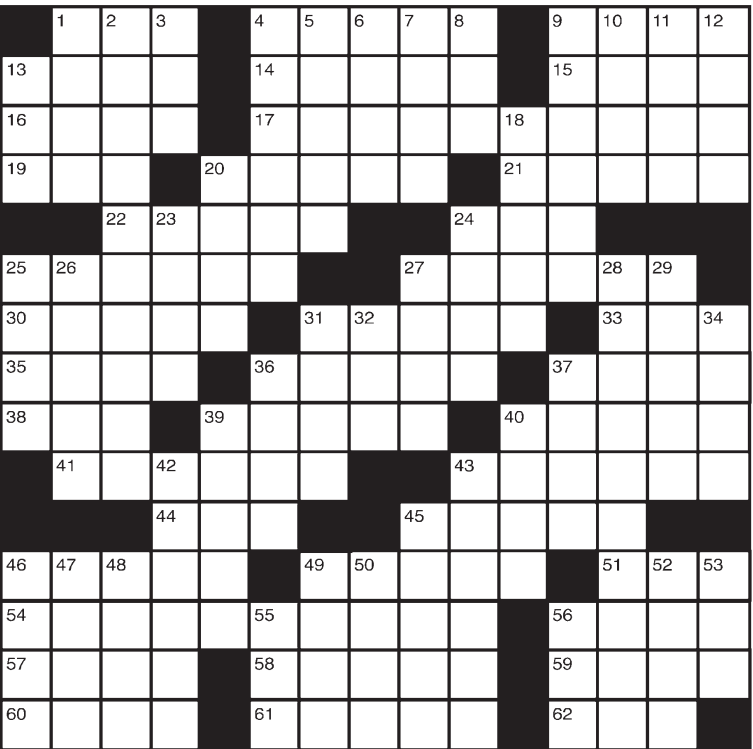
