Harper has been on the finance committee for Sisters Habitat for Humanity for three years and is board vice president. He has volunteered for Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show and Sisters Rotary for five years and volunteers at Sisters Rodeo, working the chutes for all five shows.

Erik Jambor, BendFilm Festival programmer, said, "This year's program transports audiences all around the world and through humor, drama and innovation provides a means to walk in someone else's shoes. This

program will challenge the way we relate to our environment, ourselves and each other."


