The truck essentially burned down to the axles.

"The wrecking company had to cut the trailer in half to haul it away," Olsen said. Oregon State Police, Deschutes County Sheriff's Office units and Oregon Department of Transportation all responded to help manage the incident. Cloverdale personnel washed the highway clean after the wreckage was hauled awav.

Overheated brakes are not an uncommon problem with trucks coming over the pass, and Olsen is grateful that the

situation wasn't worse.

"We're very fortunate that it wasn't something like a hazardous chemical because all trucks are susceptible to that sort of thing," he said.
