Workshops

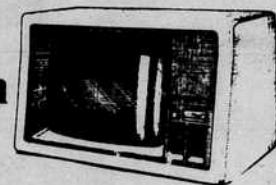

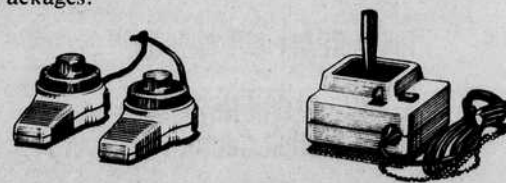
