UO music students will perform a variety of numbers in a Musical Smorgasbord at 12:30 pm in room 198, UO School of Music, free.

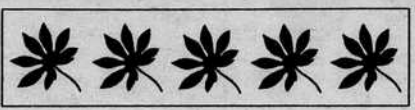
