Runa Simi—Folk Music from Bolivia

Bolivian folk musicians, Runa Simi, bring to Eugene an authentic presentation of historical music, dance, costumes and legends evolved since pre-Incan times. The reputation of this group precedes them in Eugene. Last summer they performed here before a capacity audience of 180 people. The next day they performed again in Corvallis for a crowd of 700, instead of the expected 200! They have also appeared at the Folkloric Festival in Portland, have toured in Canada, and were recently invited back to Portland's Reed College.

This concert is sponsored by the Eugene Council for Human Rights in Latin America (ECHRLA) and will benefit the indigenous peoples of Bolivia. It will be held Friday and Saturday, Jan 28-29, at the Latin American Cultural Center, 1236 Kincaid, at 7:30 pm. Admission is \$4.50 in advance, \$5.00 at the door.
