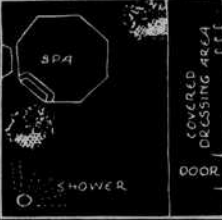

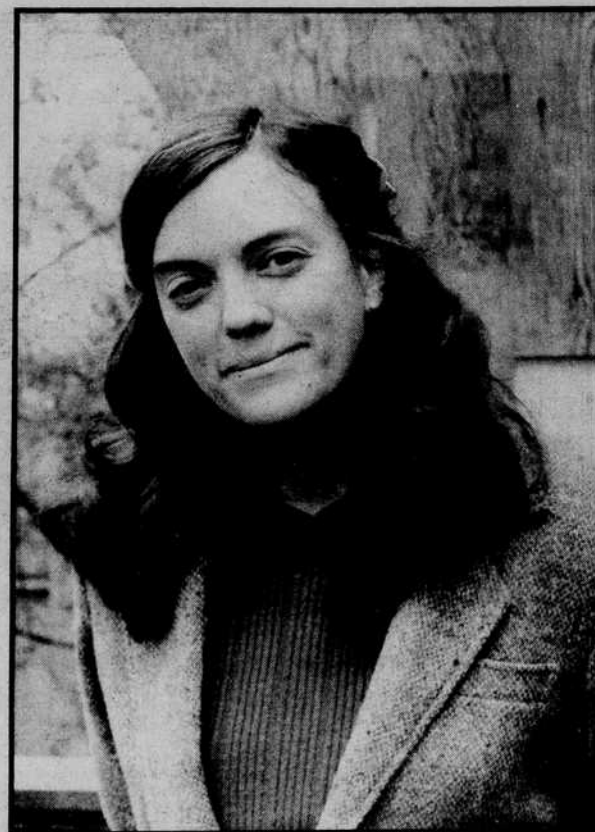

Poet Ingrid Wendt

Eugene poet Ingrid Wendt will give a reading from her recent poetry on Monday, February 14, at 7:30 pm at the Artists' Union Gallery, 985 Willamette Street. Wendt, for many years Eugene School District's Poet-in-Residence, is the author of a book of poems, *Moving the House*, and co-author of an anthology, *In Her Own Image: Women Working in the Arts*. She was the 1982 winner of the D.H. Lawrence Fellowship from the University of New Mexico. Her work is included in the recently-published *Anthology of Eugene Writers*, and appears in literary journals and magazines nationwide.

Wendt's reading is sponsored by the Artists' Union Gallery, and is made possible, in part, through the support of the Eugene Dept. of Parks and Recreation, with the Eugene Room Tax Fund.
