The City of Eugene is seeking applicants to serve on three citizen advisory committees—

**The Metropolitan Area Planning Advisory Committee (MAPAC)** is an advisory committee to the Lane Council of Governments board of directors. The committee consists of 21 members, and advised L-COG and Eugene, Springfield and Lane County on land use planning and transportation matters, including the Metropolitan Area General Plan and the T-2000 Transportation Plan.

**The Citizen Involvement Committee** is also involved with land use planning. The committee helps to ensure that citizens have the opportunity to participate in the land use planning process. Currently this committee is preparing information materials on the land use planning process for use by Eugene schools and throughout the community.

**The Sign Code Board of Appeals** currently has two openings, one for someone who has no financial interest in the sign industry and the other, a non-voting position, is open for a sign industry representative.

**Birth to Three's** comprehensive directory of pre-schools and daycare centers for children (ages 6 weeks-6 years) will be available March 1st. It will include a listing of almost 90 pre-schools/daycare centers in Lane County as well as an evaluation/checklist that you can use in selecting your child's school or center. There will also be a chart comparing the advantages and disadvantages of the various types of pre-schools. **Sacred Heart General Hospital** has been awarded a contract by the Oregon Workers' Compensation Dept. to provide physical rehabilitation and vocational assessment services for industrially injured workers. The Injured Workers' Program, effective January 1, is based on the methods used by the William A. Callahan Center in Wilsonville.

A team consisting of a physician, psychologist, vocational specialist, occupational therapist and physical therapist works together with the client in developing a comprehensive rehabilitation plan. The plan serves two purposes of equal importance. The first is information gathering. The rehabilitation team evaluates the client to determine an appropriate course of action to clarify the worker's medical and vocational situation. The second purpose of the plan is to prepare the client for returning to work. The team defines a series of goals for the physical and vocational rehabilitation of the injured worker.

The overriding goal of the program is to develop essential information to aid the injured worker in his/her re-employment. Sacred Heart's program combines the medical and vocational aspects of the worker's rehabilitation to achieve this goal.
