



The Wallflower Order, nationally acclaimed women's dance theatre collective, returns to Eugene for three performances this week. This innovative group combines dance, theatre, music, comedy, martial arts, sign language, and their own political and personal perspectives to create an exciting, often moving, performance.

The Wallflower Order has toured throughout the United States. They spent three weeks performing in Nicaragua in 1981, at the invitation of the Cultural Ministry. And in 1982, they appeared at International Theatre Festivals in Copenhagen and Zurich as the featured women's theatre group from the U.S.

They'll be here in Eugene, at the WOW Hall (where they got their start in 1975) for three evenings—Feb. 24, 25, and 26, at 8 pm. The WOW Hall is at 8th and Lincoln, and is wheelchair accessible.
