There's a small sitting area where you can relax with a newspaper, cup of coffee or tea, and a "goodie" from the tempting pastry case. The bakery has more varieties of baked goods than sold in retail stores including hard rolls and fresh pizza dough. The bakery is open from 7:30 am till 6:30 pm.
