Mason Williams will give a concert to benefit the McKenzie Flyfishers North Fork Waldo Lake Conservation Fund. The McKenzie Flyfishers is sponsoring the concert to support a bill before the Oregon Legislature to designate Lane County's Waldo Lake and the North Fork of the Middle Fork of the Willamette River as a State Scenic Waterway. They recently led local opposition to hydropower dam projects on the North Fork, proposed by local utilities. The North Fork is a wild trout only stream, not stocked with hatchery fish, and its delicate ecology and native trout populations would be threatened if the proposed hydropower projects were built, according to the flyfishers group. Waldo Lake, the source of the North Fork, is considered by Oregon biologists to be the purest lake in the U.S.

Mason Williams will perform *Of Time and Rivers Flowing* with a group of five musicians with whom he often performs: Art Maddox on piano, Amy Windus on cello, George Relles on banjo, John Averill on mandolin and Forrest Moyer on bass. The concert features music and songs about rivers—from Handel's "Water Music," to the traditional bluegrass tune "Cripple Creek," to the contemporary "Burn On" by Randy Newman. The music and songs will be supplemented by photographic images of rivers, local and worldwide.

Of Time and Rivers Flowing will be performed Saturday and Sunday, March 19th and 20th, in the Soreng Theater. Tickets are \$8.75. Call Bob Karav at 484-5763 for ticket information.

Irish Festival

Merchants, community groups, local artists, a variety of organizations, and local government officials "have been extremely helpful" in getting the first Eugene-Springfield Irish Festival underway, reports Festival organizer Peter Murphy. "Participation is what makes it so much fun."

The Official St. Patrick's Day Parade has already drawn dozens of entrants and people still have until March 11 to sign on. In addition, the parade on St. Patrick's Day, March 17, will encourage "walk-ins" to join in the parade.

The Festival begins Saturday, March 12, with a *Run for the Shamrock* and a *Golf Tourney*. Sunday begins with a brunch at the Hilton. The Conference Center will be the site of various cultural offerings on Sunday as well.

Saturday Market will be set-up in the foyer and lobby areas of the Conference Center beginning at 10 am. *Apples in Winter* will perform traditional Irish folk tunes. The *Maria Campbell Group* will perform Irish Step-dances and U of O folklorist, Barre Toelken will conduct readings and ballads. Strolling musicians and displays of Irish (national) artifacts will also be part of Sunday's cultural offerings. A full schedule of festival events is included in the *What's Happening* calendar.

Thank you, Peter Murphy, the Eugene-Springfield Convention and Visitors Bureau, and all others for bringing us the first (annual?) Irish Festival. It promises to be fun and full of Irish and Emerald Empire culture!
