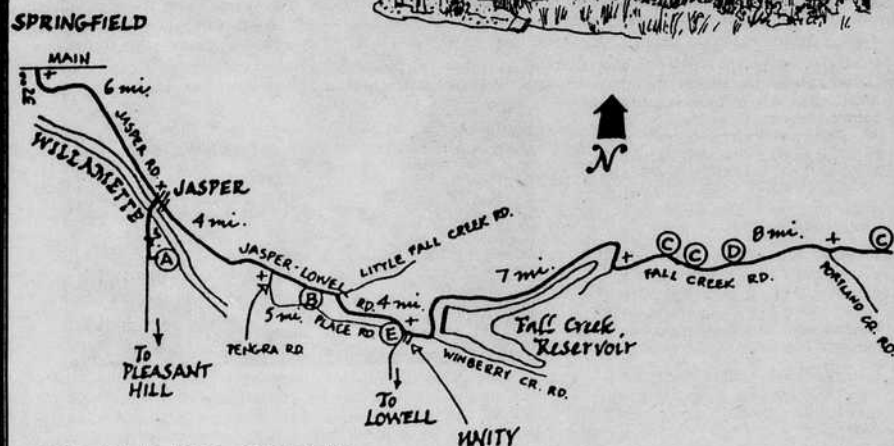
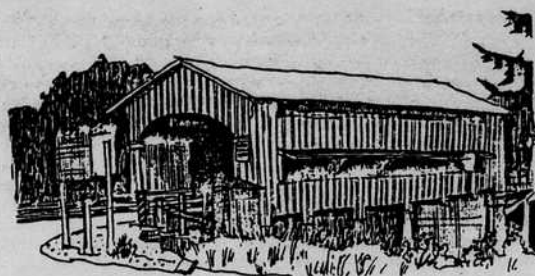


A Scenic Bicycle Tour



LITTLE FALL CREEK

Terrain: Low rolling hills.

Road Conditions: Heavy traffic on Jasper Rd. between Springfield and Jasper. Fall Creek Rd. past Fall Creek Reservoir is slightly uneven.

Total Distance: Leaving from and returning to 32nd and Main in Springfield: 59 miles.

Comments: This route takes you along the shore of Fall Creek Reservoir, then along Fall Creek. Swimming and fishing holes are plentiful in Fall Creek. Don't be surprised to find snow on the upper part of Fall Creek occasionally in the fall and spring.

Map Key:

- A. Jasper Park—a spacious park with toilets, water and picnic tables.
- B. A log house with natural wood sculptures on the porch.
- C. National Forest Campgrounds—water, toilets, picnic tables, swimming, and camping.
- D. Clark Creek Organization Camp—A group camp available by reservation. There is a nature trail about a mile that leads off from the parking lot on Fall Creek Rd.
- E. Unity covered bridge.
