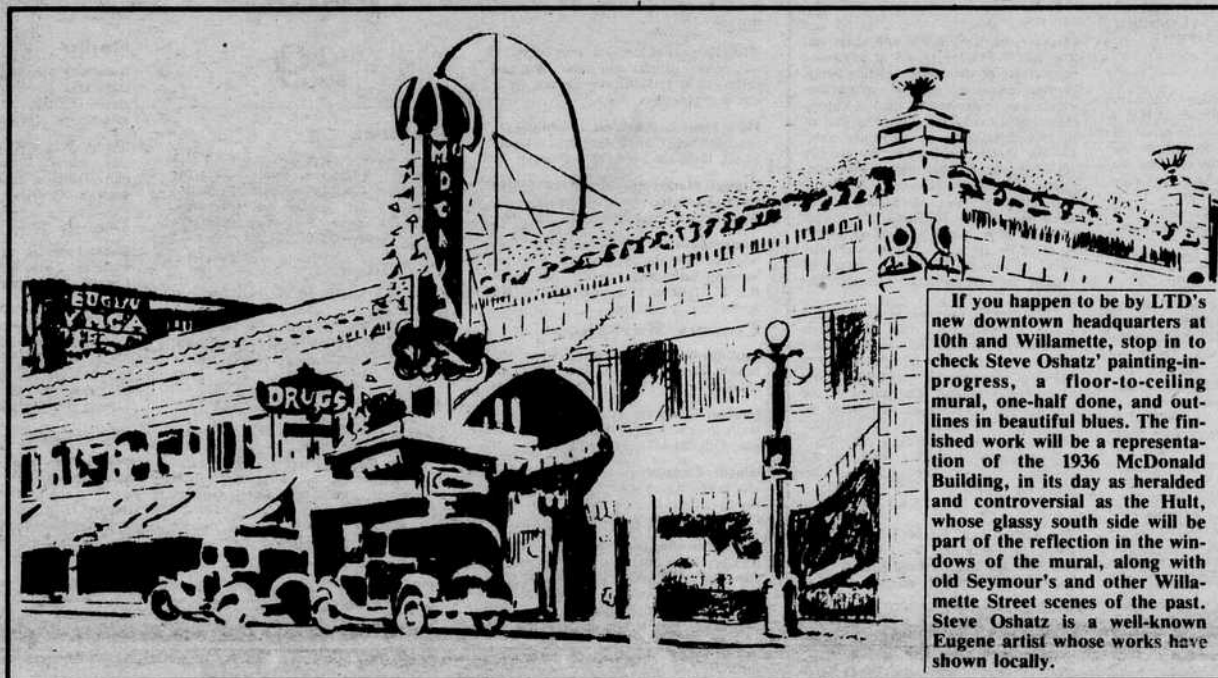

If you happen to be by LTD's new downtown headquarters at 10th and Willamette, stop in to check Steve Oshatz' painting-in-progress, a floor-to-ceiling mural, one-half done, and outlines in beautiful blues. The finished work will be a representation of the 1936 McDonald Building, in its day as heralded and controversial as the Hult, whose glassy south side will be part of the reflection in the windows of the mural, along with old Seymour's and other Willamette Street scenes of the past.
