



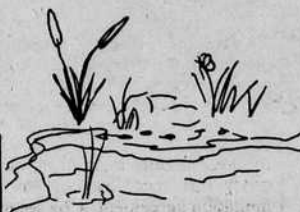

History and Mom join together on Sunday, May 8, when Eugene celebrates **Historic Preservation Week** and **Mother's Day**. Eugene's annual celebration of Historic Preservation Week will be repeated this year, offering self-guided walking tours of downtown's historic buildings. The tours begin between 1 and 5 pm on Sunday, May 8, at the former Ax Billy Department Store at the northeast corner of 10th and Willamette Streets.
