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Dali Exhibit

Happy birthday, Salvadore Dali. An exhibit of signed and numbered prints by the old master of surrealism started display this week at the **Original Graphics Gallery** at 122 E. Broadway, at the east end of the Eugene Downtown Mall.

Director Joel Donohue and staff worked for two months to collect enough of Dali's work to make a long-running exhibit worthwhile. They have a good representation of Dali's many shifting ways of expressing his art.

As one of the great movers and shakers of modern art passes his 79th birthday in the Taurus month, his work still commands respect (and high prices). Numbered prints of a limited edition are the least expensive way to own a Dali. Originals by this worldwide figure are almost prohibitive.

Dali is an artistic jokester. His surrealism, such as *Woman with Drawers* (the dresser-drawer type) is as much for amusement as for stirrings of the Psyche and the Muse. A favorite of the invitational Sunday preview hosted by Donohue was *Lincoln in Dali Vision* (\$75 unframed). Showing a nude framed in a computer-like block panorama, Lincoln would appear when the work was seen through *Dalioptics*—a fresnel lens. Actually one of the best in the show. Of course, there was a fine tapestry for \$2,400 or a 300-copy print of *Columbus Discovers America* for the same price. The light-hearted and naughty *Song of Songs* was another favorite (\$900).

The exhibit will continue for part of the summer. A good chance to enjoy this bizarre but meaningful artist (and look at some other artists, too).
