The conference will take an in-depth look at employer-participant child care and the role of business in employees' child care needs. The conference will feature afternoon workshops which will provide practical information on costs and benefits to companies and their employees. Among the scheduled speakers are Senator Bob Packwood and Eleanor Clement-Glass, child care management consultant from Seattle, Washington.

The resources, which make up L.R.A.C.'s **Artists Services**, are described as "self-help aids" to artists seeking to develop their creative opportunities and increase their income. Prices range from \$2-\$5.

Information packets available include four **Artists Survival Packets** (on Grantwriting, Performing Arts, Visual Arts, and The Artist as Professional), a guide on **How to Use Free Publicity**, and the **L.R.A.C. Media Guide**. Subscription publications are **Artists Notes Newsletter** (especially for visual, performing, and literary artists) and **Art Newsletter** (for L.R.A.C. members and arts supporters). The **Lane County Visual Artists Slide Bank**, **Performing Arts Resource Files**, and **Arts Resource Library** are services maintained for artists and the general public in the L.R.A.C. office.

**Artists Services** are partially supported by City of Eugene Room Tax Funds. Although not all are new, several have been extensively revised and updated in the past year, the Arts Council reports. This spring is the first time all have been actively marketed and promoted together.
