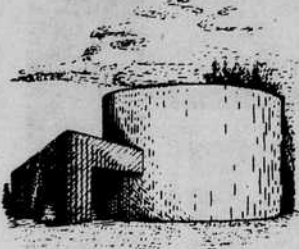


VISIT WISTEC



Looking for something to do with the whole family? Or some place special to take visitors from out-of-town? A unique and interesting spot for visitors and residents alike is WISTEC, the Willamette Science and Technology Center. WISTEC is a participatory science center, offering hands-on exhibits and science discovery activities for people of all ages. A bicycle generator measures your energy output; a nutrition computer analyzes the value of your diet; an ophthalmologist's instrument lets you measure your peripheral vision. There are experiments with lasers, light, sound, and mirrors; a hospital bed with all the trappings; an exhibit of microphotography; and much more. All of it is designed to make the principles of science accessible to both adults and children.

WISTEC is also the home of the largest and most modern planetarium between San Francisco and Vancouver, B.C. Regular planetarium shows take place on Saturdays and Sundays at 1:00 and 3:00 pm. Right now you can see the stars and planets of the *Summer Skies* at 1 pm, and *The View From Planet Earth*, a show on ancient astronomy, at 3. The shows change seasonally, so check the W.H. Calendar for weekly details.

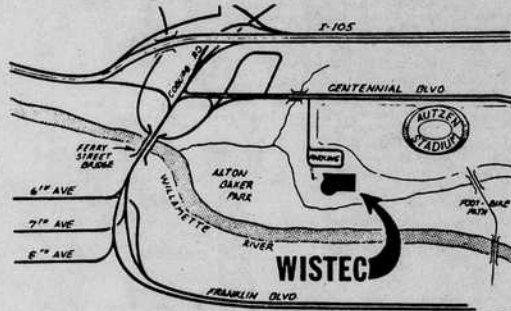
Children are welcome at WISTEC! Several thousand school kids visit each year, and there are many summer classes for children of all ages (and for adults, too). Preschool Science Discovery, Safari, Kitchen Chemistry, Model Rocketry, and Introduction to Computers are but a few of the courses for children to choose from. Computer courses run from introductory to advanced levels for children and adults as well.

Another special summer offering is Tourist Class, a series of 10 weekly field trips to local businesses and industrial sites which use unique and interesting technology. A dairy, an ice cream factory, a bakery, lumber and pulp mills, Spectra Physics, and a U of O microcircuitry research lab are a few of the 19 sites to be visited. You can sign up for one or more trips or for the whole series, which starts July 1.

Registration for all summer classes has already begun, but will continue until all classes are full. For more details on class offerings, cost, times, and dates, call WISTEC at 484-9027.

WISTEC is located behind Autzen Stadium at 2300 Centennial Blvd. in Eugene. Hours are Tuesday-Sunday, 12-5 pm, with Planetarium Shows on Saturday and Sunday at 1 and 3 pm.

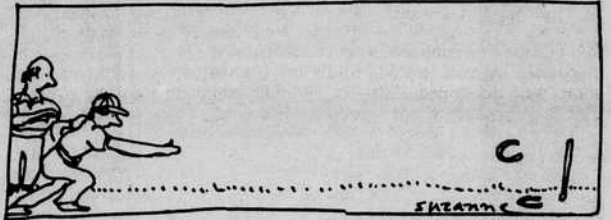
