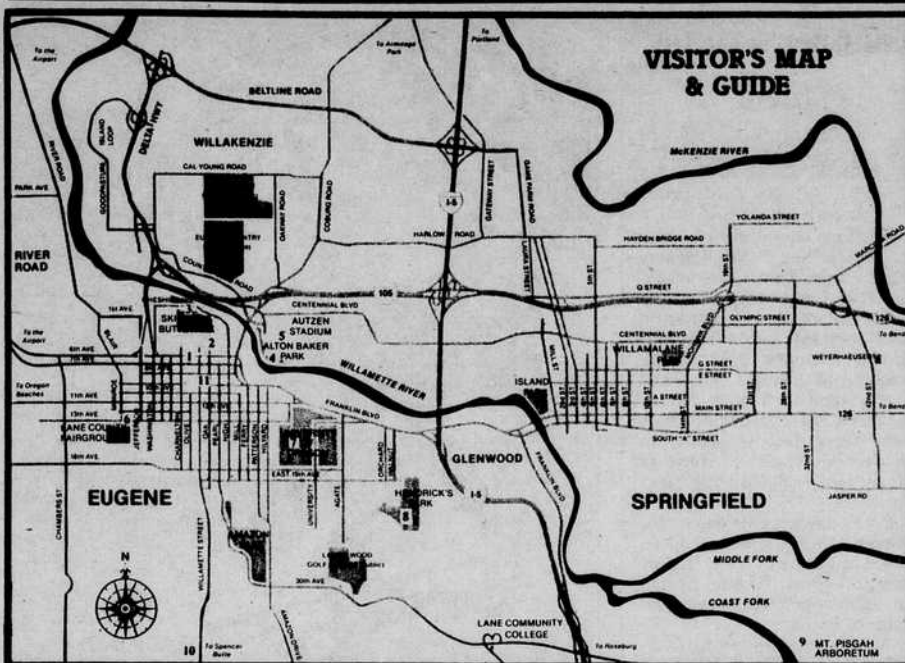




1) HULT CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS AND EUGENE CONFERENCE CENTER

The new Hult Center in downtown Eugene is a work of art in itself, with a unique architectural design and original works of art throughout. Its two concert halls—the 2,500 seat Silva Concert Hall and the smaller Soren Theater—have featured symphonies, opera, theatre, dance, and music from all over the world, as well as from Eugene's own pool of talented artists.

Adjacent to the Hult Center are the also new Eugene Conference Center, available for meetings and banquets, and the Hilton Hotel.

2) FIFTH STREET HISTORIC DISTRICT

Eugene's "old town," south of Skinner's Butte Park to Fifth Ave. and roughly between Willamette and High Streets, features many beautifully restored homes and buildings from the late 1800's and early 1900's. There are many interesting shops in this area as well, including the ever popular Fifth Street Public Market which features a fine selection of crafts, food, shops, music, and lots of local color.

3) SKINNER'S BUTTE PARK

Situated along the Willamette River and close to downtown, this park features a playground, picnic areas, playfields, and the Owens Rose Garden with over 3000 rose bushes of over 300 varieties. The wooded butte can be climbed on foot, bike, or by car, and from the top, you can see for miles! A bike path runs along the river and connects this park to Valley River Center, Autzen Stadium, the University of Oregon, and Alton Baker Park.

4) ALTON BAKER PARK

Also along the Willamette River, this park offers a variety of recreational activities including: Pre's Trail, a 4.2 mile jogging path; a 3 mile waterway ideal for canoeing (watch for blue herons); a new amphitheatre; large playfields; covered picnic areas; and boating and rafting access to the river. Part of the Willamette River Recreation Corridor, this park is connected by bike paths with Valley River Center, Autzen Stadium, the University, Skinner's Butte Park, and downtown Eugene.

5) WISTEC

The Willamette Science and Technology Center is a participatory science center featuring hands-on exhibits and science discovery activities for both children and adults. It is also the home of a planetarium with regularly scheduled weekend shows. A science gift shop offers interesting books, games, and other items. WISTEC is located at 2300 Centennial Blvd., behind Autzen Stadium. Hours are Tues-Sun, noon-5 pm, with planetarium shows on Sat and Sun at 1 and 3 pm.

6) LANE COUNTY HISTORICAL MUSEUM

The Historical Museum takes one back to the days of the pioneers who settled Oregon over a century ago, featuring stage coaches, household items, clothing, quilts, and much more. Situated next to the Lane Co. Fairgrounds on West 13th, it's open Wed-Sat, 10-4 pm.

7) UNIVERSITY OF OREGON MUSEUM OF ART

Located on the beautiful University of Oregon campus, this museum is famous for its vast collection of Oriental art. It also features art and photography exhibits and a gift shop. See Art Galleries for details on current exhibits. Open Wed-Sun, noon-5 pm. (Closed June 30-Sept. 7.)

8) HENDRICKS PARK

Hendricks Park, an 81.5 acre wooded parkland which overlooks Eugene, features an exquisite rhododendron garden with over 3000 rhododendrons and azaleas. The garden reaches its peak in early May, but retains its beauty throughout the year. Surrounding the garden is a wooded park with 300 year old trees, hiking trails, picnic and play areas.

9) MT. PISGAH ARBORETUM

Located along the Coast Fork of the Willamette River, at the base of the 1520 foot Mt. Pisgah, the Arboretum features trees and shrubs from around the world. The network of over 4 miles of trails takes you through forests of Douglas fir, stands of incense cedar and centuries-old Oregon oaks, through sunny meadows, past a lily pond, and to a vista point from which the surrounding countryside can be seen. Visitors receive plant and bird lists and trail maps, and a guide if you prefer. The Arboretum is open during daylight hours, year around.

10) SPENCER BUTTE

Just a few miles south of Eugene lies the highest vista point in the area. A fairly gentle trail leads all the way to the top, from which you can see a full 360 degree panorama. The one-way hike takes about an hour, at a leisurely pace, and is well worth the effort, especially on a clear sunny day!

11) SATURDAY MARKET

Saturday Market is Eugene's unique outdoor crafts fair featuring fine local crafts, a wonderful variety of food, and entertainment. The Market sets up each Saturday in the Park Blocks at 8th & Oak Streets, and is open from 10 am-5 pm. The colorful booths and displays create a festive atmosphere in downtown Eugene.

Aperture in the Erb Memorial Union, UO Campus. Photographs by Scott Brown will be on display through July 11.

Emerald Empire Art Association, 421 N "A" St., Springfield. The Front Gallery will feature pictures in multi media including oils, watercolor, ink, pastel of wildlife and western scenes by local artist Karen Pidgeon. Hours: 11 am-4 pm.

Erb Memorial Union, Main Lobby, UO Campus. A series of 14 posters condensing the exhibit featured at the Hult Center during the Bach Festival will be on display through July 22. It is entitled *Germans to America, 300 Years of Immigration, 1683-1983*. Hours: Mon-Thurs 7 am-7 pm, Fri 7 am-4 pm. Closed weekends.

Galerie de Chevrier, 430 Highway 101, Yachats, OR. One-man exhibit of original oil paintings by Michael Gibbons, Oregon artist. Hours: 11 am-9 pm daily.

Green Earth Art Center, 1155 W. 1st St. Oils by Doris Prieto. Watercolors by Pat Renwick. Drawings by Jan Cantwell and Lon Haverly as well as artworks by guest artists Dorothy Warr, Kerry Kinman, Julia Lucich, Karen Snider, Mickey Wing, Beverly Leonard, Ione Brown, Jorge Ramos, Ellen Gabehart, and students of Green Earth. Hours: Mon-Sat 10-5.

High St. Coffee Gallery, 1243 High St. Yarn paintings and masks by Mexican Indians are on display through July 3. Hours: Mon-Fri 8 am-11 pm, Sat-Sun 10 am-11 pm.

Insight Gallery of Fine Arts, 5th St. Public Market, 296 E. 5th, Eugene. On-going exhibit of original paintings. Hours: 10 am-6 pm Mon-Sat, 11 am-5 pm Sun.

Old Friends, 1128-A Alder St. Mexican Folk Art exhibit include Huichole yarn paintings, ceremonial masks in wood, ceramics and paper mache, weavings, huipiles, bags and wall hangings. Hours: Mon-Sat, 10:30-5:30.

Opus 5 Gallery of Crafts, 2469 Hilyard St. Mostly Bows is an exhibit of functional pottery by Eugene artist Joanne Taylor. On display through June.

Original Graphics Gallery, 122 E. Broadway. Lithographs, tapestries, etchings and sculpture by Salvador Dali. Also reference books and posters. Through August 1. Hours: 11-5:30, Tues-Sat. 344-5580.

Project Space Gallery, 39 E 10th. A rotating group show of its Gallery Artists is on display during July. Each artist will change his work periodically. Hours: Fri, Sat, noon-5 pm.

Ragan Gallery, 95020 Hwy. 101 (between Sea Lion Caves and Yachats) features Robert Sherwood's seascapes in oil and Nolan Peterson's watercolors. Through October. Hours: 11 am-5 pm, 1-547-3596.

Springfield Museum, 6th and Main Sts., Springfield. The Sand and the Cave: Early Peoples of the Northern Great Basin will be on display until Oct. 28. It contains 50 items excavated at archeological sites in southeastern Oregon. Exhibit was designed by Jan Coleman who has designed them for the UO Museum of Natural History. Hours: 11 am-5 pm, Wed-Sat.

UO Faculty Club (Collier House), University & 13th Sts. Works by Ann Baldwin, Silvia Samaras Beres, Peg Gulteau, Sheila Jones and Sylvia Seder will be on display through July 15. Art Attack '83, works by Janet Bruce, Jeff Johnson and others, is on display July 1-Aug 12. Hours: 9 am-3 pm.

University of Oregon Library, UO Campus. The Kalapuya: Native Peoples of the Willamette Valley. This exhibit includes illustrations, maps, artifacts found in the valley, quotes from early traders, tools, weapons, stories, photographs and explanations of the Indians' ways. It was put together by the Natural History Museum. Through July 8 (when it will move to WISTEC until Sept. 7). Reguar library hours.

U of O Museum of Natural History, Science Complex, UO Campus. An exhibit of extraordinary, rare 19th century Macedonian Bridal Costumes will be on display until July 31. Hours: Tues-Sun, 12-5 pm.

Warehouse Artists Studio Gallery, 385 Lawrence St. Watercolors by Massachusetts/New York artist Billy Riley contain imagery encompassing pop culture icons and traditional Celtic motifs. The political volume is turned up loud. July 8-31. Opening reception on the 8th, 8 pm. Hours: 10 am-3 pm, Mon-Fri.

WISTEC (Willamette Science & Technology Center), 2300 Centennial Blvd. The Kalapuya: Native Peoples of the Willamette Valley will be on display July 10-Sept 7. Includes artifacts found in the Willamette Valley as well as quotes from early diaries. Hours: noon-5 pm Tues-Sun.

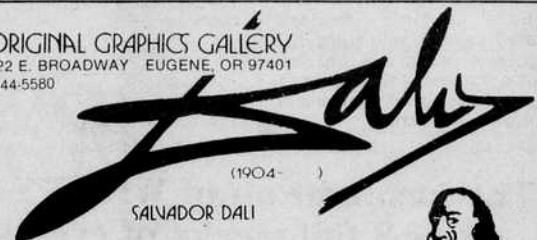
