**Community Village**

Community Village at the Oregon Country Fair can be understood as a symbol of the community ideals of the Fair and an experiment in living those ideals for the three days of the Fair each year. The Village is comprised of eighteen booths, each made up of agencies, organizations, and, most importantly, individuals working in specific areas of community building: human services, the arts, health, communication, spirituality, lifelong learning (the concept that humans can continue learning and growing to meet an ever-changing environment), economic cooperation, politics, food issues, Little People and Youth, New Games (fun without losers), information and networking, neighborhoods and communities, environmental awareness, local self-reliance, appropriate technology and, newly added this year, Native Peoples. There is also the Integral House, central to Village life, a restaurant, and even a Village daily newspaper.



Everyone is welcome to stop by the Village for a visit: question a master gardener, take a guided wild edible walk, learn more about environmental awareness, take part in a workshop, find out what issues and needs are being addressed in human services, see the Village Play, participate in New Games, be heard in a forum, find some quiet meditative time in a pyramid, or get a free hug.

The Community Village embodies a vision—a vision of people coming together for work and support, communication and play, in an effort to effect the future of the human community, and the survival and evolution of our planet. Join in, July 8-10, at the Oregon Country Fair.

# RIDE THE BUS TO THE COUNTRY FAIR.

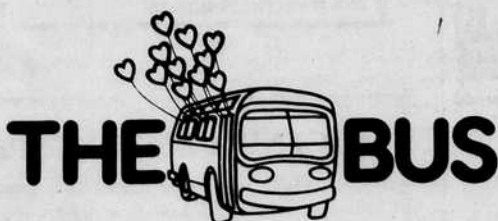
Thanks to Lane Transit District, you can ride the bus to the Oregon Country Fair, July 8th, 9th and 10th.
