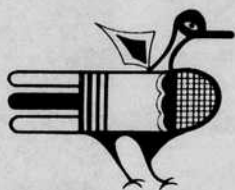

Information in Motion is the theme for 25 workshops to be held in cities throughout Oregon during September, October and November. The workshops are designed to help counselors and career educators make better use of Oregon's Career Information System. Morning sessions will introduce participants to the components of the computer-based system and provide for "hands-on" experience. Afternoon programs will address the significance of information for understanding occupational trends, future careers and evolving informational needs. The system provides up-to-date material on more than 124 career training and educational programs at more than 200 academic and vocational schools in Oregon.
